



# FLEAS A CRASH COURSE

<p>Fleas transmit lots of diseases, worms, and drink blood – but the <b>WORST MOST COMMON</b> problem is the itching they cause.</p>	<p>If we find fleas on your critter, they are <b>PROBABLY</b> (by far) the <b>number one cause of serious itching in some pets</b>. Not all dogs and cats are even allergic to flea bites.</p>	<p><b>FLEA ALLERGY DERMATITIS</b> Is usually “head to toe” with an emphasis on legs, and RUMP area. Above the tail. The tailhead. Whatever.</p>
<p>Flea control on the pet is “pretty easy” if you use the <b>RIGHT STUFF</b> from the right places. One lady found NexGard at a drug store <i>without</i> a prescription. Needless to say, it didn’t work because it was fake. Bravecto, Simparica, and other “me-too” products including sometimes my OWN Frontline Topical are inadequate, in a fair number of cases. <b><u>It sounds “salesy” but really, get it from a vet or human pharmacy so it’s real.</u></b></p>	<p><b>FLEA CONTROL IN YOUR HOUSE</b> This is <b>IMPORTANT</b> to “get on top of” the infestations the fastest. Flea control in the <b>HOUSE</b> is vastly underestimated in value with fleas. <b>A damp mop in wood floors</b> and synthetic flooring areas is <b>REALLY</b> useful. Laundering the bedding will clear a lot of pupae and larvae.</p>	<p><b><u>BOMBS like Black Flag and RAID</u></b> at Amazon.com will clear the house pretty quick.</p> 
<p><b>WHAT TO TREAT FLEAS WITH, ON PETS</b> Capstar followed by <b>NextGard, NextGard Combo, Comfortis, Credelio, or Revolution</b> even for cats. Ask my staff because they are “up” on the latest discounts and special pricing that’s available. We’re cheaper than the Internet but mainly due to <b>rebates, coupons and specials</b> the manufacturers give us.</p>	<p><i>“I use <b>NEXTGARD</b> products on my pets for fleas and ticks. I use <b>HEARTGARD</b> on my pets for heartworm prevention and deworming. Simple.” -Erik</i></p>	<p><b>YARD CONTROL</b> Go to Home Depot and buy <b><u>Spectracide Granules for Fleas</u></b>. And put it in a grass seed spreader and distribute in high traffic “animal areas”. It works. It doesn’t go airborne so it won’t kill ladybugs and happy butterflies.</p>
 <p><b>Fleas are extremely small and are easiest to find under, and on, the tail and inside the hind legs.</b></p>	<p><b>Anhydrous Boric Acid Here:</b></p> 	<p><b><u>Anhydrous Boric Acid.</u></b> Facebook Groups (the <i>best</i> source of incorrect, specious ideas about Veterinary Medicine) suggest 20 Mule Team Borax which is boric acid, but <u>it’s NOT anhydrous boric acid</u>. All you need to do is find <b><u>ANHYDROUS boric acid (Fleabusters and similar) and it’ll work.</u></b></p>
