

What Is So Great About Phycox?

Nutshell: If you've been referred to this document or page, it's because I think your dog would *noticeably* benefit from Phycox, and probably avoid some of the heavier-hitters "medicine-wise" for a longer time. (Putting off the step into "drugs" and more expensive "medicine" for your dog's arthritis)

This is for dogs that are elder, and have mild arthritis.

We carry **five** different "things" for older dogs.

- We have a glucosamine chondroitin msm supplement (Cosequin^{#1} / Dasaquin^{#2})
- We have a multivitamin^{#3} (Water soluble vitamins are not well absorbed in old timers and are well supplemented)
- We have Deramax^{#4} and Novox^{#5} which are anti-inflammatories.

Then someone invented "**Phycox**"

It has **all five things plus some**, in one chewable. For less money than most of the above. As such, it can be used earlier in life; in dogs that aren't "all the way out there" with arthritis and in dire need of pain relief from arthritis, it can be used with great success in ANY aging dog.

What Phycox gives your dog:

1. Chewability. (Chewableness) (new word)
2. **Multivitamins** including (and if not especially) C, Zinc, Selenium, Manganese and E.
3. **Turmeric** (Curcumin) and Astaxanthin (**Phycocyanin**) (Antioxidants)
4. **Resveratrol** (Grape Seed Extract) (Antioxidant)
5. **Omega Fatty Acids** and a **DHEA** precursor. (Anti-inflammatory)
6. **Glucosamine / Chondroitin** and **MSM** (Cartilage / joint repair)
7. **Creatine** (Cell metabolism / repair, especially mitochondrial)

There's a drawback.

Phycox isn't "medicine" and isn't an adequate avenue to control seriously painful bones and joints with milder medicine than your dog already requires. If your dog is already on the Emory Protocol for pain, it's not going to do as well on Phycox alone.

Phycox is 60% as good at arthritis pain as Deramax or Novox. So, for dogs in significant discomfort from arthritis / back pain - Phycox is just a boost - not a mainstay.

But for the majority of "older" dogs with "minor creaks and groans" -- Phycox is your huckleberry.
