Life on Apoquel



Apoquel is an oral (pill) **anti-itch** dermatology drug from

Zoetis that **Caused cancer** in up to 12% of test animals. That was in Zoetis' own reports for the FDA/EPA. Nobody was trying to "'expose" anything.

Apoquel works by crushing part of the immune system. Sort of the part that causes a dog to 'over-react' itchily in the skin. (But also *part* of the part that prevents skin cancers like cutaneous T-cell lymphoma.)

But this cancer rate has kept a lot of people with "sort of frequent" allergy issues OFF OF IT and I think that's great. MY thinking: Why risk cancer (cutaneous T-cell Lymphoma) for "occasional allergy flareups"?

But, there are dogs who are almost-always red, balding, crusty, itchy,

MISERABLE. Crying. And the owners who listen to them suffering in their own skins, night after night. When the owner comes in and says "I honestly think Cinderblock would be better off dead than living like this." -- THAT is when I think about Apoquel.

I have put at least 7 dogs on Apoquel over the years. And **three** things happen:

1. They don't itch anymore and it's amazing.

- 2. They get serious infections in their feet sometimes.
- 3. One of them died of Lymphoma already.

SO what is life like on Apoquel? What Can You Expect?

1. The dog stops itching almost entirely

- 2. Dogs take the medicine at "some level and interval" for the very very long term.
- 3. They don't have steroid-thirst and hunger anymore

4. They pee a LOT less without the steroid

- 5. They predictably get infections in their feet once or twice a year
- 6. They have a 92% chance of NOT getting cancer
- 7. Their coat gets healthy and the owners are happy.
